





Project Summary


- Bethpage (BWD), South Farmingdale (SFWD), and Massapequa (MWD) Water Districts
- Replacement of approximately 6.6 miles of water main across 47 roads (≈24 Empire State Buildings)
- Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) grant funds for water main replacements
- New York State (NYS) Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC) document review










Problems

- Piping failures
 - Reaching end of useful life
 - Water loss and system disruptions
 - Transite/Asbestos Concrete Pipe (ACP)
 - NYSDOL Industrial Code Rule 56 (ICR 56)
- High costs to repair breaks





Water Main Replacement Programs


- Eliminate problem sections
- Increase water pressure or supply to underserved areas
- Long-term planning
 - Planning, design, permitting, bidding, construction
 - Cost spread out over multiple yearly budgets
 - Balance replacement work with necessary plant upgrades
- Prolonging replacements can be costly





Solution – State Grant Funding

- New York State Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) Grant
- Under an Intermunicipal Grant (IMG)
 - Can be awarded up to \$30M or 40% of eligible costs
 - Reduce costs through economy of scale
 - Single design firm
 - Single Contractor or separate Contractors for lowest price
 - Eligible costs include:
 - Project planning
 - Design
 - Construction services
 - Construction



Benefits


- Subsidized cost of construction
 - Expedite replacements
 - Proactive replacements not just reactionary
 - Replace more pipe
- Lower cost for design and construction
- Streamlined coordination efforts





Drawbacks

- Learning curve for process, IMG new as of 2017
- Complex agreement between Districts
- Waiver process
- Holding off critical work until grant is awarded
- Tracking and submissions during construction





Technical Challenges

- Permitting with local and state health departments
- Coordination with paving schedules
- Coordination with other utilities
- Changes during construction
- Poor soils and high groundwater in MWD
- Expediting construction while waiting on EFC waiver approvals



- Total Project Budget
- Plan of Project Finance
- Engineering Report
- Smart Growth Assessment Form
- State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) Determination – each District
- State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO)
 Determination each District
- Intermunicipal Agreement (IMA)
- State Revolving Fund (SRF) Financing
 Application (If no bonding) each District
- Minority Business Officer (MBO)



Application Stage - Challenges

- Intermunicipal Agreement (IMA)
 - Difficult to get set up
 - Coordination between District's counsel, then with state
 - Negotiations between Districts
 - Valid and binding agreement in the eyes of NYS
 - One party disburses funds from State
 - Money divided evenly between all District's
 - EFC will disburse 75% of grant, holding 25% for after project completion

Example:

\$10M Estimated Total Construction Cost (all 3 Districts) \$4M Grant Funds Awarded \$1.333M Grant Funds per District



Post-Award Stage

- Managed by NYS Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC)
- Request for any missing information
- Request for revisions to any submitted documents
- Execute agreement between NYS and Lead Municipality


Bidding Stage

- NYS EFC Terms and Conditions Bid Packet
 - Known as EFC Bid Packet at time of job
- Contractor Utilization Plans
 - Minority and Women Owned Business Enterprises (MWBE)
 - Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business Program (SDVOB)

Bidding Stage - Challenges

- Alternate bid sheets and ways to award
 - Same Contractor for all 3 Districts
 - Same Contractor for 2 Districts and 1 Separate
 - Separate Contractor for all 3 Districts
- 2 active crews available at all times





Construction Kick-Off

- Review of MWBE and SDVOB Utilization Plans
- Waiver Requests
 - Letter explaining need for waiver
 - Scope of work break down
 - Screenshots of search results
 - Excel log of solicitation attempts
 - Copies of advertisements
 - Specialty equipment/services
 - Sub-contractor quotes

Monthly Reporting

- Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO)
 Workforce Utilization Report to EFC
- Monthly MWBE-SDVOB Report to MBO
- Proof of Payment by Contractor to Subs
 - Final report with all utilization plan changes and change orders
- Each District responsible for approving their own invoices
 - MWD as lead agency will apply for and disperse funds



Successful Take-aways

- All parties need to be educated on the process
 - Conference calls with NYS EFC and all Contractors
 - Pre-Award Primer with MBO and NYSEFC
 - Plans to invite EFC to pre-construction meeting
- Owner, Engineer, and Contractor need to work as a team
- Overall construction cost will be higher due to grant paperwork, but ultimately savings for Owners
